

Expiration of Unemployment Insurance Programs

NOTE: The information provided below is generally applicable. Some minor variations may exist due to differences among the states.

Emergency Unemployment Compensation (EUC)—Additional weeks of benefits

- Individuals who exhaust regular state unemployment compensation (UC) after December 21, 2013 (in NY, December 22, 2013) are NOT eligible for EUC.
- EUC benefits are available for weeks of unemployment ending on or before January 1, 2014. This means that the last payable week of EUC benefits will be the week ending December 28, 2013 (in New York, December 29, 2013).
- There is no “phase-out” period for EUC payments. All EUC payments will cease when the program ends.

Extended Benefits (EB)—Additional weeks of benefits

- As of January 12, 2014, EB is not currently available in any state.

NOTE: Individuals who have no remaining benefits based on their initial regular state UC claim may be eligible for UC in a second benefit year if they had sufficient intervening employment and meet all other requirements of state law. If you think you may be eligible, check with your state.
